The City Council Chamber is open to the public; To submit a comment or to request to speak to agenda items, please complete the City Council Virtual Comments Form (jotform.com). Please confirm if you wish to appear via zoom or inperson. Residents requesting to participate via zoom must submit the request by 5:00 P.M. the day prior to the Council meeting and will receive an email invitation to register with instructions on how to participate, including a unique password that cannot be used by other individuals. Zoom participants will be removed from the call following the conclusion of their item and are invited to observe the remainder of the meeting on the Greensboro Television Network (GTN). Residents may also register in-person on the night of the meeting using an on-site Qminder kiosk. On-Site speaker requests must be entered by 6 p.m.

A Qcode is available for scanning onto personal cell phone devices should residents prefer. All comments received are subject to the public records law and will be posted on the City of Greensboro website.

The first regular meeting of the month is for Council consideration of public forum comments, ceremonial/presentational, consent, public hearing, and business items as needed.

The second regular meeting of the month is for Council consideration of consent, public hearing, and business items. The zoning application hearing process allows proponents and opponents a total of fifteen (15) minutes notwithstanding the number of persons desiring to be heard. Proponents shall be heard first followed by comments from opponents. Each side may speak a total of five (5) minutes rebuttal.

# RESOLUTION HONORING THE LEGACY AND CONTINUED IMAPACT OF THE COACH AI LOWE BOXING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Coach Al Lowe began his boxing journey as a student on a local high school team and later continued to box while serving in the United States military;

WHEREAS, in the late 1960s, upon returning to Greensboro, Coach Lowe recognized an opportunity to turn neighborhood rivalries into opportunities for structure, discipline, and personal growth through the sport of boxing;

WHEREAS, in 1972, Coach Lowe founded the Coach Al Lowe Boxing Program at Lindley Recreation Center, launching what would become one of Greensboro's longest-standing and most impactful youth development initiatives;

WHEREAS, what began as a grassroots effort to provide direction and mentorship to young men evolved into a decades-long community-based program that continues to change lives and foster personal transformation;

WHEREAS, over the years, the program has served thousands of youth, especially those from underserved and economically challenged communities, providing not only athletic training but mentorship, structure, and life skills;

WHEREAS, today the Coach Al Lowe Boxing Program continues to thrive, serving over 300 youth annually, with 40 to 60 active participants training four days a week, year-round, under the careful supervision and guidance of a dedicated coaching staff;

WHEREAS, the current coaches, Head Coach Robert Chapman, Coach Carey Cagle, Kennard Morehead, and Mickey Osborne, are all former participants in the program who experienced firsthand the transformative impact of Coach Lowe's vision and now serve as mentors and role models to the next generation;

WHEREAS, these coaches promote far more than athletic excellence, instilling core values such as accountability, mutual respect, discipline, and resilience principles that prepare young people for success both inside and outside the ring;

WHEREAS, a major source of inspiration and aspiration for participants is the program's traveling boxing team, consisting of 10 to 12 youth athletes who represent Greensboro in USA Boxing Foundation-sanctioned events across the Southeast;

WHEREAS, the program benefits from substantial support from Greensboro Parks and Recreation, including facility space, coaching salaries, equipment, and transportation services; the Greensboro Boxing Club has also established a partnership with One Step Further, Inc., through which private funding is facilitated, and to whose support the program is gratefully indebted; other expenses such as lodging and meals, have been historically covered through personal contributions from coaches and volunteers;

WHEREAS, despite financial challenges, the program's continued growth and success demonstrate its resilience, relevance, and importance as a beacon of hope, opportunity, and community empowerment for young people in Greensboro;

WHEREAS, as the City of Greensboro works to ensure equity in youth services and foster safe, enriching environments for all children, the Coach Al Lowe Boxing Program stands as a powerful example of what sustained, community-rooted investment can achieve; and

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO:

- 1. That the City Council hereby honors the life and legacy of Coach Al Lowe and celebrates the more than 50-year history of the Coach Al Lowe Boxing Program as a cornerstone of youth development in Greensboro.
- 2. The City Council extends its deepest appreciation to Head Coach Robert Chapman and Coaches Carey Cagle, Kennard Morehead, and Mickey Osborne for their continued leadership, dedication, and mentorship, and recognizes them as both stewards and shining examples of Coach Lowe's enduring vision.

# RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING GREENSBORO DAY SCHOOL BASKETBALL COACH FREDDY JOHNSON

WHEREAS, the City of Greensboro is proud to honor and recognize Greensboro Day School's Boys Basketball Coach Freddy Johnson, who currently the holds the most wins for a high school coach in North Carolina history;

WHEREAS, Coach Johnson, a native of Greensboro, graduated from Grimsley High School in 1972; Greensboro College in 1977, where he played basketball for two (2) years; and received his Master's degree from North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University in 1984;

WHEREAS, Coach Johnson coached Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) basketball teams; volunteered with the Greensboro Day School basketball squad; was appointed Head Boys' Varsity Basketball Coach; and one year later, was named Greensboro Day School's Athletic Director; and presently, he is the school's Director of Basketball Operations;

WHEREAS, during his 48 years and counting tenure at Greensboro Day School, Coach Johnson has grown the athletic program to include over 40 programs, 150 conference championship teams, and 45 state championship teams; and is the winningest coach in North Carolina history with an overall record of 1,190-328; that is a winning average of 78.73%, and he is one (1) of only eight (8) coaches to achieve the 1,100 wins milestone;

WHEREAS, under his guidance, the Greensboro Day School Bengals have advanced to the North Carolina (NC) state championship title game an impressive 21 times in the past 36 seasons, capturing the championship trophy a record 12 times in the North Carolina Independent School Athletic Association (NCISAA); and was a finalist nine (9) times;

WHEREAS, Coach Johnson's success at Greensboro Day School led to him being selected as coach in seven (7) all-star games, including the 1997 Classic All-Star Game; the 2013 McDonald's All-American Game; and the 2017 Jordan Brand Classic;

WHEREAS, throughout his career; Coach Johnson has been lauded and recognized, including USA Today 2015 North Carolina Coach of the Year; inducted into the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2016; 2017 National Coach of the Year by BallisLife; in 2020 he was recognized with the Morgan Wootten Award for Lifetime Achievement in Coaching High School Basketball by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame; and MaxPreps honored him as one of the Top 100 High School Coaches in the country across all sports;

WHEREAS, the City of Greensboro, NC is honored to recognize such an exemplary sportsman and winning streak; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO:

1. That it hereby recognizes and congratulates the hard work, efforts, and accomplishments of and by Coach Freddy Johnson; and

Whereas, the Interdenominational Ushers Association of North Carolina, Inc. (IUA-NC, Inc.) was founded in 1925, bringing together church ushers of all denominations from across the state of North Carolina and parts of Virginia to serve in unity, faith, and community purpose;

Whereas, for 100 years, the IUA-NC, Inc. has promoted the welfare of churches, supported charitable causes, provided college scholarships to youth, and advanced the ministry of ushering, remaining true to its original vision and mission;

Whereas, the organization initially consisted of ten districts, including Franklin County, Raleigh, Greensboro, Fayetteville, Roxboro/Virgilina, Wilmington, Chatham County, Kinston, Orange County, and Durham, and continues to operate through six functioning districts today;

Whereas, in 1957, the association made a historic investment by purchasing the old Franklinton Christian College, completing payment in 1968, and developing the 75-acre property into a community resource that included a dormitory, auditorium, and multiple facilities;

Whereas, following a devastating fire in 1989, the association demonstrated extraordinary resilience by planning and constructing a new facility, with groundbreaking held on July 13, 2002, and a dedication service in August 2003;

Whereas, today, the Interdenominational Ushers Association of North Carolina, Inc. operates through departments including Trustees, Supervisors, Youth/Young Adult, Arts & Crafts, First Aid, Finance, and the Ushers Institute, continuing to serve as a beacon of leadership, service, and spiritual unity;

Whereas, the IUA-NC, Inc. meets twice annually for its Midyear Session (two weeks after Easter) and Annual Session (the weekend of the second Sunday in August), bringing members together to celebrate their faith, heritage, and purpose; and

#### **PURPOSE**:

The Greensboro Police Department has received funds from the U.S. Department of Justice and U.S. Department of Treasury Equitable Sharing Programs ("Federal Forfeiture") in the amount of \$1,492,618. The department wishes to purchase an emergency operations response vehicle with the funds. Approval of the budget ordinance is requested from the Greensboro City Council in accordance with current city fiscal procedures.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Greensboro Police Department wishes to purchase an emergency operations response vehicle. The desired vehicle is specifically built for emergency management, on-scene operations, special teams, and major disaster response. The vehicle improves communication capabilities by providing a mobile dispatch center, which helps manage the workload of emergency communication divisions during incidents.

Title 21, United States Code, Section 881 (e) allows local law enforcement agencies to share in the proceeds from the sale of seized assets and cash from certain criminal investigations. The Police Department has received proceeds from the Department of Justice Equitable Sharing Program based upon the Police Department's involvement in the originating investigations and/or arrests which generate the seizures. The funds must be spent solely on law enforcement

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purposes by the law enforcement agency. Sharing will be withheld from any agency where federal equitable sharing funds are transferred to non-law enforcement agencies or expended for non-law enforcement purposes.

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting funding for a two-year contract with a one-year optional extension for Temporary Labor Services.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Parks and Recreation has been contracting with temporary labor staffing firms to ensure timely service delivery in an efficient and effective manner. The department utilizes temporary labor services for: 1) Events and Engagement; Central Business District (CBD) Maintenance and Special Events. 2) Public Space Development and Maintenance, Mowing and Landscaping along with Park Maintenance.

On June 3, 2025, Procurement Services issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Temporary Labor Services for Parks and Recreation. The RFP was solicited under Event Number 11933 using the Greensboro e-Procurement System (GePS). The GePS solicitation was sent to 738 vendors, additionally, 28 M/WBE vendors were notified from a list provided by the M/WBE office. The City received ten responsive bids for this service, with 4 being from Certified M/WBE firms.

A selection committee reviewed the submitted responsive bids. The committee evaluated the bid on responsiveness to the specifications criteria, price, experience and qualifications, and references. Due to challenges of the current provider to fill all temporary labor staffing needs consistently, Parks and Recreation decided it was in the best interest of the City to de-bundle and award to multiple vendors. Blue Arbor, Inc. a certified WBE with the State of North Carolina was determined to the best value to provide Temporary Labor for Central Business District (CBD) Downtown Maintenance and Special Events.

The Office of Business Opportunity reviewed the documentation for Temporary Labor Services submitted by the Solid Waste & Recycling Department to determine compliance with the M/WBE Program Plan. The Temporary Labor Contract is for Light Industrial Laborer for Yard Waste and Bulk Collection. The OBO had advanced input in the specification process, and respondents were eligible to receive up to a total of ten (10) points for M/WBE participation. No contract goals were established for the services.

LaLa World LLC, dba HireQuest Direct, a WBE firm, was one of the selected vendors and will be awarded a total estimated contract value of \$850,500.00 (\$283,500.00 annually). This includes the price of \$18.90 an hour for light industrial laborer for yard waste and bulk collection services. The vendor will self-perform the services for two years with a one-year renewal option. Services shall begin approximately September 16, 2025, through September 15, 2027.
