### PURPOSE:

This public hearing is to receive public comment on the Greensboro's Redistricting Committee's recommendations to City Council concerning its proposed revisions to the City's electoral districts.

### BACKGROUND:

On August 31, 2021, the City Council passed a resolution creating the Greensboro Redistricting Committee. The Committee's tasks were to (1) determine whether the City Council districts must be revised to comply with applicable law, and (2) if not legally required, whether it would still be advisable to rebalance the districts to reduce the disparity in population among the five districts; and (3) if redistricting is required or advisable, propose revisions to the district lines that comply with law and such other legally allowable criteria as the Committee may determine advisable. The Committee was authorized to present one or more alternative proposals to City Council for consideration.
