#### **PURPOSE**:

To adopt an ordinance in the amount of \$1,500,000 to support American Rescue Plan Act enabled projects.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On January 3, 2023, City Council adopted a resolution and ordinance to commit 1,500,000 of American Rescue Plan Act enabled funds to support a community housing project of Habitat for Humanity to build homes in East Greensboro. Because the ordinance was adopted with a 5-4 vote, it requires a second reading, in accordance with the City's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Article II, Division 1, Sec.2-21(c). This meeting will provide the second reading for Council consideration.

# **BUDGET IMPACT:**

A transfer from the American Rescue Plan Act Special Revenue Fund grant will fund government services expenditures in the General Fund, allowing general revenues to support \$1,500,000 of expenditures for this request.
