PURPOSE:

The City of Greensboro has received \$22,292 in additional proceeds relating to the settlement of opioid litigation which was disbursed on or about January 25, 2023. Approval of the budget ordinance is requested from the Greensboro City Council in accordance with current city fiscal procedures.

BACKGROUND:

The City entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments September 2021. The MOA is intended to facilitate compliance by the State and by the Local Governments with the terms of the National Settlement Agreement and, to the extent appropriate, in other settlements related to the opioid epidemic reached by the state of North Carolina.

These funds are the first opioid claim payment provided by the bankruptcy reorganization plan of opioid maker Mallinckrodt and will be made to all 114 North Carolina local governments receiving payments under the North Carolina MOA. This payment from Mallinckrodt is in addition to the opioid settlement payment amount previously projected local governments would receive in fiscal year 2022-23, which all governments already received in September and November of 2022. The Mallinckrodt funds are to be deposited into the special revenue fund that was established pursuant to the MOA. These funds are governed by the MOA in every respect and in the same manner as other opioid settlement funds -- including MOA provisions about how opioid settlement funds are to be allocated, used, and reported.

There is no adverse budgetary impact. The funds will be housed in account 233-35-3598147.
