**PURPOSE:**

The City of Greensboro has received \$81,826.46 in additional proceeds relating to the settlement of opioid litigation which was disbursed on or about July 20, 2023. Approval of the budget ordinance is requested from the Greensboro City Council in accordance with current city fiscal procedures.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments September 2021. The MOA is intended to facilitate compliance by the State and by the Local Governments with the terms of the National Settlement Agreement and, to the extent appropriate, in other settlements related to the opioid epidemic reached by the state of North Carolina.

The MOA states the settlement funds shall be distributed annually to the State and to Local Governments in such proportions and for such uses as set forth in the MOA, provided Opioid Settlement Funds shall not be considered the funds of the State or any Local Government unless and until such time as each annual distribution is made. Local Governments may spend settlement funds for high impact opioid abatement strategies to include, but not limited to,

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collaborative strategic planning, evidence-based addiction treatment, early intervention, post-overdose response teams, and naloxone distribution.

It is recommended that City Council adopt the attached budget ordinance amending special revenue funding in the amount of \$81,826.46 for the settlement of opioid litigation proceeds.
