PURPOSE:

City Council is requested to approve the Twin Lakes Park Master Plan completed in July 2022.

BACKGROUND:

Located at 3009 Twin Lakes Drive, Twin Lakes Park includes the Twin Lakes Tributary, which eventually empties to S. Buffalo Creek. This park is one of Greensboro's many linear neighborhood park that encompasses approximately 4.93 acres. The park includes a stream, wetlands and floodway.

The Twin Lakes Park master plan is funded through the City of Greensboro's Participatory Budgeting process. It was one of 3 projects funded in District 5 during the Greensboro Participatory Budgeting (PB) Cycle 2, which ended in 2019.

Engagement included one focus group, two in-person events and online questionnaires. The data gathered showed that most of the residents in the Twin Lakes neighborhood were concerned about property damage during flooding events and enjoyed their connection to nature. The two engagement efforts received overwhelming support for the master plan recommendations. The recommendations for renovations for Twin Lakes Park are as follows: Water Level Management, Connectivity Through Greenway Trails, Safety and User Experience, Environmental Education and Awareness.

The Parks and Recreation Commission approved the Twin Lakes Park master plan at the May 10, 2023 meeting and recommended acceptance by City Council.
