

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KEY FINDINGS

Downtown Greensboro has an abundance of parking. Of the land in the study area, 36% is dedicated to parking.


The majority of parking is comprised of privately operated parking facilities.



5% of land is publicly owned parking

KEY FINDINGS


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PARKING IS PAID IN LOW DEMAND AREAS

- Public parking decks are currently underutilized.
- Public parking decks can absorb parking demand from many expected future developments.

PARKING IS FREE IN HIGH-DEMAND AREAS

- Free public surface lots and on-street spaces along Elm Street generate high parking demand, but low turn over.
- Higher turnover rates in high demand areas are needed to support the success of the mobility system as a whole.

KEY TAKE AWAYS

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OUTDATED POLICIES

Legacy policies and procedures decrease the efficiency and sustainability of the parking system.

INEQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Parking supply is not equitably distributed downtown, leading to a long-term parking shortage in the South End.

INEFFICIENT UTILIZATION

Parking turnover has not been prioritized, resulting in fewer available parking spaces during high demand times of day.

LAGGING INVESTMENTS

Investment in the existing public parking decks has been deferred, resulting in a backlog of maintenance needs.

SAFETY CONCERNS

Safety and the perception of safety impact the customer's parking experience.

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ABUNDANCE OF PARKING

The high number of parking options hinders the public parking system from being financially sustainable.

RECOMMENDATIONS

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Modernize and simplify policies and procedures. Align with Greensboro's mobility goals and future needs.



Invest in maintenance and technology to enhance and simplify the customer parking experience.




Invest to off-set displaced parking in the South End. Ensure parking is priced to create financial sustainability.



Implement a modern asset management program that supports businesses, employees, and Greensboro's mobility goals.



Update curb management strategies to generate more parking turnover. Meter parking in high-demand areas.
