PURPOSE:

The purpose of this amendment is to establish the Civil Service Board according to Chapter VII, Section 7.45 enacted by Session Law 2023-112 of the North Carolina General Assembly.

BACKGROUND:

In compliance with the above mentioned General Assembly Legislative action, City Council shall by ordinance establish the Civil Service Board (CSB). A CSB Committee was formed in early 2024 and meets monthly and the planning and development of the CSB.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The budget impact for the Fiscal Year 24-25 is \$50,000. This allocation is for half of the budget year due to the establishment of the Board to be January 2025.
