PURPOSE:

The Greensboro Police Department has been awarded a BJA FY24 National Public Safety Partnership—Capacity Building Grant in the amount of \$500,000 for a two year grant. A budget ordinance is needed to expend the award.

BACKGROUND:

The program's goal is to provide PSP sites, of which Greensboro is one, with additional resources to implement recommendations that facilitate the sites' strategic plans to reduce violence. PSP qualifying sites have completed two years in the program and/or have completed their 3-year engagements. These resources are intended to fund personnel and technological enhancements to support the department's strategic plan and PSP assessment recommendations. The PSP funded support will enhance the department's capacity to combat violent crime, increasing their potential to be sustained over time.

Objectives

- Enhance current programs and/or establish new programs that address the goals of the site's strategic plan and assessment recommendations.
- Support the analysis of data to focus resources on violent crime reduction.

- Establish and/or expand programming that enhances the local jurisdiction's ability to prevent and respond to violent crime effectively and sustainably.
- Expand programming to strengthen the role of communities as co-producers of public safety.

The police department will hire a grant-funded Crime Analyst and will purchase equipment and software subscriptions designed to enhance analytical capacity for crime reduction.

The grant does not require a match or additional City funds.
