PURPOSE:

City Council is requested to hold a public hearing on November 19, 2024 to receive public comments on the award of the 2024 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds in the total amount of \$261,523 to be administered by the Greensboro Police Department. The funding will be divided between the Greensboro Police Department, Guilford County Sheriff's Department, and the High Point Police Department. This public hearing is a requirement of the administration of the JAG Grant pursuant to applicable Federal law. The allocations for each jurisdiction are:

- Guilford County: \$ 66,547
- City of Greensboro: \$ 154,860.80
- City of High Point: \$ 40,115.20

BACKGROUND:

Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program awards are direct to local jurisdictions. The allocation is from a formula-based, non-competitive federal criminal justice funds which does not require a match. A wide range of activities that support justice based programs are eligible for funding. The grant award is calculated by the Bureau of Justice Statistics, based upon a specific formula and involves the state's share of the national population and the state's share of the country's Part 1 violent crime statistics.

Vision Statement: "A Community with Endless Economic Opportunities and Exceptional Quality of Life."

City Council authorized the application for the Justice Assistance Grant on October 1, 2024; however, the funder requires the City to provide an opportunity for public comment. Greensboro, High Point and Guilford County projects will be included in the public hearing agenda item on November 19, 2024.
