PURPOSE:

City Council is asked to vote on approving the sale of property at 407 Gillespie Street owned by the Redevelopment Commission of Greensboro to Trinity Construction and Development, LLC for a single family home project.

BACKGROUND:

Trinity Construction and Development, LLC will build a 1,256 square foot single family house in the Eastside Park redevelopment area.

The Redevelopment Commission of Greensboro (RCG) voted in favor of the sale under the terms of a Sale and Development Agreement at their meeting on December 4, 2024. Since that time, Trinity Construction and Development has met the terms specified for purchasing the lot. The property was advertised for upset bid as required by North Carolina statute 160A-269 and City charter Section 4.122. This parcel is in the Eastside Park redevelopment area and this development is in conformance with the Plan and the zoning in the area.

The \$5,000 will be Community Development Block Grant program income.
