PURPOSE:

Resolution to approve the conveyance of two vehicles to the Town of Black Mountain.

BACKGROUND:

The Town of Black Mountain sustained significant damage from Hurricane Helene. Damage estimates for infrastructure and assets are \$30,000,000. Josh Harrold, Town Manager for the Town of Black Mountain, requested a donation of two vehicles slated to be sold as surplus from the City of Greensboro. The request includes one (1) 2007 Ford Explorer 4x4 valued at approximately \$2,450 and one (1) 2015 Ford F-150 4x4 truck valued at approximately \$6,650. North Carolina General Statute 160A-274(b) for the Sale, lease, exchange and joint use of governmental property, states, "Any governmental unit may, upon such terms and conditions as it deems wise, with or without consideration, exchange with, lease to, lease from, sell to, or purchase from any other governmental unit any interest in real or personal property."
