

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CITY OF GREENSBORO 2026 STATE AND
FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE AGENDA**

WHEREAS, the City of Greensboro is experiencing significant economic growth driven by major investments in advanced manufacturing, aviation, logistics, and technology industries expected to bring more than 20,000 new jobs to the region;

WHEREAS, Greensboro is home to eight colleges and universities and produces approximately 25,000 graduates annually, creating one of the strongest workforce pipelines in the State of North Carolina;

WHEREAS, Greensboro successfully initiated and secured the opportunity to host the 2029 World University Games, which will bring more than 7,000 international athletes and an estimated 600,000 visitors to North Carolina;

WHEREAS, continued economic growth requires strategic investment in public safety, infrastructure, housing, workforce development, transportation, and water and sewer capacity, including Greensboro's Road to 10K initiative to support the development of 10,000 new housing units;

WHEREAS, the City of Greensboro annually adopts a legislative agenda to communicate its priorities to the North Carolina General Assembly and the United States Congress;

WHEREAS, the legislative agenda identifies key priorities to ensure Greensboro continues to serve as a driver of economic opportunity and innovation for North Carolina and the region; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO:

Section 1. Adoption of Legislative Agenda.

The City Council hereby adopts the City of Greensboro 2026 State and Federal Legislative Agenda outlining the City's priorities related to economic development, housing, workforce development, infrastructure, transportation, and public safety.

Section 2. Legislative Advocacy.

The Mayor, City Manager, City Attorney, and the City's intergovernmental affairs representatives are authorized and directed to advocate for the priorities identified in the legislative agenda with members of the North Carolina General Assembly and the United States Congress.

Section 3. Distribution.

The City Clerk is directed to distribute copies of the adopted legislative agenda to members of the North Carolina General Assembly, the United States Congress, and other relevant state and federal agencies.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
